It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- SECTION 1. Sections 11-47-2 and 11-47-42 of the General Laws in Chapter 11-47 entitled
 "Weapons" are hereby amended to read as follows:
 - 11-47-2. Definitions.

When used in this chapter, the following words and phrases are construed as follows:

- 5 (1) "Antique firearm" is defined as that term is defined under the provisions of 18 U.S.C.
- 6 § 921.

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7 (2) "Binary trigger" means a device that replaces a standard trigger on a semi-automatic
8 weapon and is designed to fire one round on the pull of the trigger and another round upon release
9 of the trigger.

(3) "Bump-fire stock" means any device that replaces a semi-automatic weapon's standard
stock and is designed to slide back and forth rapidly, harnessing the weapon's recoil to rapidly fire
the weapon.

(4) "Crime of violence" means and includes any of the following crimes or an attempt to commit any of them: murder, manslaughter, rape, first- or second-degree sexual assault, first- or second-degree child molestation, kidnapping, first- and second-degree arson, mayhem, robbery, burglary, breaking and entering, any felony violation involving the illegal manufacture, sale, or delivery of a controlled substance, or possession with intent to manufacture, sell, or deliver a controlled substance classified in schedule I or schedule II of § 21-28-2.08, any violation of § 21-28-4.01.1 or § 21-28-4.01.2 or conspiracy to commit any violation of these statutes, assault with a dangerous weapon, assault or battery involving grave bodily injury, or assault with intent to commit
 any offense punishable as a felony; upon any conviction of an offense punishable as a felony
 offense under § 12-29-5.

4 (5) "Electric arm" means a handheld device that transmits an electric charge from the
5 device to a person, including a stun gun or taser.

6 (5)(6) "Firearm" includes any machine gun, pistol, rifle, air rifle, air pistol, "blank gun", 7 "BB gun", <u>electric arm</u>, or other instrument from which steel or metal projectiles are propelled, or 8 that may readily be converted to expel a projectile, except crossbows, recurve, compound, or 9 longbows, and except instruments propelling projectiles that are designed or normally used for a 10 primary purpose other than as a weapon. The frame or receiver of the weapon shall be construed 11 as a firearm under the provisions of this section.

12 (6)(7) "Fugitive from justice" means any person who has fled from any state, territory, the
 13 District of Columbia, or possession of the United States to avoid prosecution for a crime of violence
 14 or to avoid giving testimony in any criminal proceeding.

15 (7)(8) "Licensing authorities" means the board of police commissioners of a city or town 16 where the board has been instituted, the chief of police or superintendent of police of other cities 17 and towns having a regular organized police force, and, in towns where there is no chief of police 18 or superintendent of police, it means the town clerk who may issue licenses upon the 19 recommendation of the town sergeant, and it also means any other person or body duly authorized 20 by the city or town charter or by state law.

(8)(9) "Machine gun" means any weapon that shoots, is designed to shoot, or can be readily restored to shoot automatically more than one shot, without manual reloading, by a single function of the trigger. The term also includes the frame or receiver of the weapon, any combination of parts designed and intended for use in converting a weapon into a machine gun, and any combination of parts from which a machine gun can be assembled if the parts are in the possession or under the control of a person.

27 (9)(10) "Person" includes an individual, partnership, firm, association, or corporation.

(10)(11) "Pistol" includes any pistol or revolver, and any shotgun, rifle, or similar weapon
with overall length less than twenty-six inches (26"), but does not include any pistol or revolver
designed for the use of blank cartridges only.

31 (11)(12) "Sawed-off rifle" means any rifle with overall length of less than twenty-six inches
32 (26") or barrel length of less than sixteen inches (16").

33 (12)(13) "Sawed-off shotgun" means any shotgun with overall length of less than twenty 34 six inches (26") or barrel length of less than eighteen inches (18").

(13)(14) "Sell" includes let or hire, give, lend, and transfer, and "purchase" includes hire,
 accept, and borrow, and "purchasing" shall be construed accordingly.

3 (14)(15) "Trigger crank" means a trigger actuator that attaches to the trigger of a semi4 automatic weapon and causes the weapon to fire by turning the crank handle.

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<u>11-47-42. Weapons other than firearms prohibited.</u>

6 (a)(1) No person shall carry or possess or attempt to use against another any instrument or
7 weapon of the kind commonly known as a blackjack, slingshot, billy, sandclub, sandbag, metal
8 knuckles, slap glove, bludgeon, stun-gun, or the so called "Kung-Fu" weapons.

9 (2) No person shall with intent to use unlawfully against another, carry or possess a 10 crossbow, dagger, dirk, stiletto, sword-in-cane, bowie knife, or other similar weapon designed to 11 cut and stab another.

(3) No person shall wear or carry concealed upon his person, any of the above-mentioned
instruments or weapons, or any razor, or knife of any description having a blade of more than three
(3) inches in length measuring from the end of the handle where the blade is attached to the end of
the blade, or other weapon of like kind or description.

Any person violating the provisions of these subsections shall be punished by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or by imprisonment for not more than one year, or both, and the weapon so found shall be confiscated.

Any person violating the provisions of these subsections while he or she is incarcerated within the confines of the adult correctional institutions shall be punished by a fine of not less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) nor more than three thousand dollars (\$3,000), or by imprisonment for not less than one year nor more than five (5) years, or both, and the weapon so found shall be confiscated.

24 (b) No person shall sell to a person under eighteen (18) years of age, without the written 25 authorization of the minor's parent or legal guardian, any stink bomb, blackjack, slingshot, bill, 26 sandclub, sandbag, metal knuckles, slap glove, bludgeon, stungun, paint ball gun, so called "kung-27 fu" weapons, dagger, dirk, stiletto, sword-in-cane, bowie knife, razor, or knife of any description 28 having a blade of more than three inches (3") in length as described in subsection (a) of this section, 29 or any multi-pronged star with sharpened edges designed to be used as a weapon and commonly 30 known as a Chinese throwing star, except that an individual who is actually engaged in the 31 instruction of martial arts and licensed under § 5-43-1 may carry and possess any multi-pronged 32 star with sharpened edges for the sole purpose of instructional use. Any person violating the 33 provisions of this subsection shall be punished by a fine of not less than one thousand dollars 34 (\$1,000) nor more than three thousand dollars (\$3,000), or by imprisonment for not less than one

- 1 year nor more than five (5) years, or both, and the weapons so found shall be confiscated.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
